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
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Men's Club Membership Meeting



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Family Portrait - Elaine Louise Miller Rosoff by Renée Noren



I am the daughter of Elaine (Louise Miller) Rosoff, who is a Resident at Mozaic Jewish Home. My history with Mozaic Jewish Home goes back three generations to the former Jewish Home for the Elderly and then Jewish Senior Services. Both my grandmothers were Residents at The Jewish Home. As a mother by then, I would visit often with at least one of my sons but frequently with all three. We would visit while the boys would play, sit on their laps as they read them books, or have a snack together.

Elaine became familiar with the Adult Day Program at Mozaic Senior Life when my father attended. She also attended readily when she had stopped driving and needed more social activities. In May 2019, she moved into Mozaic Assisted Living after experiencing some health issues. It did not take her very long to look forward to and participate in all activities and outings offered. When asked if she wanted to "go", her immediate response was "yes". She would tell me during each visit that she felt safe and at home with her new family. Elaine is described as a positive person engaging in conversation and including all around her. Simply said, she made everyone her friend.

Elaine was born at Bridgeport Hospital on October 2, 1927, to Lillian Binder Miller (Frost) and Jacob Miller. She lived her first four years in New York City and Bridgeport on the weekends. After her father left the family during her first year, her mother Lillian needed to work. When the Depression hit, Elaine would spend the weekdays in an orphanage in NYC. This would ensure she was warm, fed, and cared for on workdays. On Fridays, Lillian would pick up Elaine and both took the train to Bridgeport and stayed with grandparents, aunts, and uncles. At the age of four, Elaine told her mother and grandparents that she did not want to go back to the orphanage. Elaine's grandparents offered to have her stay and live with them. When Elaine was five years old, she met her friend Justine who was four. (They remain friends for 91 years and

counting!) Elaine met Stanley at the Jewish Community Center in downtown Bridgeport when he registered for his free membership as a returning Veteran. They lived most of their married life in Connecticut - Storrs, Milford, Bridgeport, Westport, and Fairfield. Elaine and Stanley raised their three children (Mark, Renee, and Gary) to be active, involved, honest, friendly, open, academic, and kind.

Elaine was a homemaker and a volunteer for many years. She was involved in the Congregation B'nai Israel sisterhood. She taught countless people, both children and adults, how to swim. Both Stanley and Elaine loved entertaining, whether themed parties or last-minute weekend get togethers at our home. They also loved traveling and took every opportunity to explore America as well as other parts of the world.

Elaine started working as a bookkeeper when her children were teenagers and even went to Norwalk Community College to sharpen her skills. Later, when Stanley and Elaine started their own security business, she managed the office - first in Westport then in Fairfield. Even though she was still working, Elaine started to volunteer at the Maritime Center in Norwalk amassing over 1,000 hours. Elaine moved to Mozaic Assisted Living years later after her Stanley had passed away.

Then COVID-19 became a way of life. It was during that time that the value of Mozaic Senior Life took center stage fully in bright lights. Not only was the actual campus built to minimize exposure, but staff was trained and ready. Communication about all issues was extraordinary and brought families of Residents some comfort. Through it all, Elaine was safe and cared for with love and expertise. FaceTime became our communication until distant visits were allowed. I did hear so often from the staff how many of them would go to her room to feel some cheer: Elaine would greet them with a smile, a compliment, a question about how they were doing. She reciprocated their attention with her own.

Elaine now lives in Siebert House in longterm care. She had a period of adjustment but continues to remind me that she is safe and happy. Even when she asks me to take her home and I remind her that she is home, she smiles and says, "that's right." Recently her dementia has worsened, and her health has declined. Elaine continues to share smiles, laughs, and witty one-liners. She has family and friends that visit often but Elaine also lives with her Mozaic family - the other Residents and most notably, the staff. As I am now serving on the Board of Directors and the Professional Services Committee, I hope to express our family's gratitude to all who helped build and maintain this facility, volunteers who give their time, and the incredible, caring, and professional staff at this "home" called Mozaic Jewish Home.
